The Union Public Service Commission have decided that professional and technical qualifications such as a pass in Sections 'A' and 'B' of the A.M.I.E., Graduateship Examination of the Institution of Electronics and Tels-communication Engineers etc. which are recognised by the Government as equivalent to degree in Engineering for purposes of recruitment to Superior Services/posts under the Central Government should also be recognised for purposes of admission to competitive examinations conducted by them for recruitment to non-technical Services/posts (viz., the I.A.S. etc. Assistants' Grade and Combined Defence Services Examinations) for admission to which a degree of a recognised University or equivalent has been prescribed as the basic educational qualification.

I am directed to refer to your letter No:DS/40, dated 2nd February, 1978, addressed to the Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms, copy ~~encl~~ endorsed to this office, on the subject noted above, and to state that the UPSC have already decided that professional and technical qualifications such as a pass in Sections 'A' and 'B' of the AMIE, Graduateship Examination of the Institution of Electronics and Tele-communication Engineers, etc. which are recognised by the Government as equivalent to degree in Engineering for purposes of recruitment to Superior Services and posts under the Central Government should be recognised for purposes of admission to competitive examinations conducted by them for recruitment to non-technical Services/posts (viz. the IAS etc., Assistants' Grade and Combined Defence Services Examinations) for admission to which degree of a recognised University or equivalent has been prescribed as the basic educational qualification. This decision was given wide publicity and a copy of the Press issued by the Commission on 29.12.77 is enclosed for your information.

THE CENTRES AND THE DATE OF HOLDING THE EXAMINATION AS MENTIONED ABOVE ARE LIABLE TO BE CHANGED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE COMMISSION.

Applicants should note that there will be a ceiling on the number of candidates allotted to each of the centres except Chennai, Delhi, Dispur, Kolkata and Nagpur. Allocation of Centres will be on the 1st application basis and as per the capacity of a particular centre. If the centre is not filled, the candidates who could not get the centre due to ceiling, will be required to choose a Centre from the remaining ones. Applicants are, thus, advised that they may apply only so that they could get a Centre of their choice.

NOTE: Notwithstanding the foregoing provision, Commission reserves the right to change the Centres at their discretion if the situation demands.

1. CANDIDATES TO ENSURE THEIR ELIGIBILITY FOR THE EXAMINATION:

More issue of e-Admission Certificate to the candidate will not imply that his/her candidature has been finally cleared by the Commission.
Commission take up verification of eligibility conditions with reference to original documents only after the candidate has qualified for interview/Personality Test.

2. HOW TO APPLY
Candidates are required to apply Online only by using the website www.upsconline.nic.in. Brief instructions are given in Appendix-II. Detailed instructions for filling up online applications are available on the above mentioned website.

N.B. (ii)—Candidates admitted to the examination under the proviso to para 3(iii) will be considered only for the posts mentioned in the said proviso and their preference for other Services and Posts, if any, will be ignored.

N.B. (iii)—The candidates will be allotted to various Services/Posts only in accordance with their merit position, preferences exercised by them and number of vacancies, subject to their medical fitness.

2 (B) A candidate may apply for admission to the examination in respect of any one of the categories of the Services/Posts mentioned in para 2 above viz. Civil Engineering or Mechanical Engineering or Electrical Engineering or Electronics & Telecommunication Engineering

3. ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS:

(i) Nationality:

A candidate must be either:

- (a) a citizen of India, or
- (b) a subject of Nepal, or
- (c) a subject of Bhutan, or
- (d) a Tibetan refugee who came over to India before the 1st January, 1962 with the intention of permanently settling in India, or
- (e) a person of Indian origin who has migrated from Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka or East African countries of Kenya, Uganda, the United Republic of Tanzania, Zambia, Malawi, Zaire and Ethiopia or from Vietnam with the intention of permanently settling in India.

Provided that a candidate belonging to categories (b), (c), (d) and (e) above shall be a person in whose favour a certificate of eligibility has been issued by the Government of India.

A candidate in whose case a certificate of eligibility is necessary, may be admitted to the examination but the offer of appointment may be given only after the necessary eligibility certificate has been issued by the Government of India.

(ii) Age Limits:

- (a) A candidate for this examination must have attained the age of 21 years and must not have attained the age of 33 years on the 1st January, 2014 i.e. he/she must have been born not earlier than 2nd January, 1984 and not later than 1st January, 1993.
- (b) The upper age limit of 30 years will be relaxable upto 35 years in the case of Government Servants of the following categories, if they are employed in a Department/Office under the control of any of the authorities mentioned in column 1 below and apply for admission to the examination for all or any of the Service(s)/ Post(s) mentioned in column 2, for which they are otherwise eligible.

(i) A candidate who holds substantively a permanent post in the particular Department/Office concerned. This relaxation will not be admissible to a probationer appointed against a permanent post in the Department/Office during the period of his probation. However this relaxation will be admissible to a probationer so appointed provided he/she already retains a lien on a permanent post in a Department/Office under the control of any of the authorities mentioned in column 1 below.

(ii) A candidate who has been continuously in a temporary service on a regular basis in the particular Department/Office for at least 3 years on the 1st January, 2014.

NOTE—The period of apprenticeship if followed by appointment against a working post on the Railways may be treated as Railway Service for the purpose of age concession.

(c) The upper age limit prescribed above will be further relaxable—

- (i) Upto a maximum of five years if a candidate belongs to a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe.
- (ii) Upto a maximum of three years in the case of candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes who are eligible to avail of reservation applicable to such candidates. The closing date fixed for the receipt of the application will be treated as the date for determining the OBC status (including that of creamy layer) of the candidates.
- (iii) Upto a maximum of five years if a candidate had ordinarily been domiciled in the State of Jammu & Kashmir during the period from the 1st January, 1980 to the 31st December, 1988.
- (iv) Upto a maximum of three years in the case of Defence Service personnel disabled in operations during hostilities with any foreign country or in a disturbed area, and released as a consequence thereof.
- (v) Upto a maximum of five years in the case of ex-servicemen including Commissioned Officers and ECOs/SSCOs who have rendered at least five years Military Service as on 1st January, 2014 and have been released (i) on completion of assignment (including those whose assignment is due to be completed within one year from 1st January, 2014) otherwise than by way of dismissal or discharge on account of misconduct or inefficiency, or (ii) on account of physical disability attributable to Military Service or (iii) on invalidment.
- (vi) Upto a maximum of five years in the case of ECOs/SSCOs who have completed an initial period of assignment of five years of Military Service as on 1st January, 2014 and whose assignment has been

extended beyond five years and in whose case the Ministry of Defence issues a certificate that they can apply for civil employment and they will be released on three months notice on selection from the date of receipt of offer of appointment;

(vi) Upto a maximum of 10 years in the case of deaf-mute and orthopaedically handicapped persons.

NOTE (i)—Candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes and the Other Backward Classes who are also covered under any other clause of Para 3 (ii)(c) above, viz. those coming under the category of Ex-servicemen, persons domiciled in the State of J & K, deaf-mute and orthopaedically handicapped etc. will be eligible for grant of cumulative age relaxation under both the categories.

NOTE (ii)—The term ex-servicemen will apply to the persons who are defined as ex-servicemen in the ex-servicemen (Re-employment in Civil Services and Posts) Rules, 1979 as amended from time to time.

NOTE (iii)—The age concession under Para 3(i) (c)(v) and (vi) will not be admissible to Ex-Servicemen and Commissioned Officers including ECOs/SSCOs, who are released on their own request.

NOTE (iv) Notwithstanding the provision of age relaxation under Para 3(i) (c)(vi) above, a physically handicapped candidate will be considered to be eligible for appointment only if he/she (after such physical examination as the Government or appointing authority, as the case may be, may prescribe) is found to satisfy the requirement of physical and medical standards for the concerned Services/Posts to be allotted to the physically handicapped candidates by the Government.

NOTE (v)—A candidate will be eligible to get the benefit of community reservation only in case the particular caste to which the candidates belong is included in the list of reserved communities issued by the Central Government. If a candidate indicates in his/her application form for Engineering Services Examination that he/she belongs to General category but subsequently writes to the Commission to change his/her category to a reserved one, such request shall not be entertained by the Commission.

Candidates seeking reservation/relaxation benefits available for SC/ST/OBC/PH/Ex-Servicemen must ensure that they are entitled to such reservation/relaxation as per eligibility prescribed in the Rules/Notice. They should be in possession of all the requisite certificates in the prescribed format in support of their claim as stipulated in the Rules/Notice for such benefits, and these certificates should be dated earlier than the due date (closing date) of the application

While the above principle will be followed in general, there may be a few cases where there was a little gap (say 2-3 months) between the issuance of a Government Notification envisaging a particular community in the list of the reserved communities and the date of submission of the application by the candidate. In such cases the request of change of community from General to Reserved may be considered by the Commission on merit.

N.B.—The candidature of a person who is admitted to the examination under the age concession mentioned in Para 3(i)(c) above shall be considered if, after submitting his application he/she resigns from service or his services are terminated by his/her department/office either before or after taking the examination. He/she will, however, continue to be eligible if he/she is reattached from the service or post after submitting his application. A candidate who after submitting his application to the department is transferred to other department/offices will be eligible to compete under departmental age concession.

SAVE AS PROVIDED ABOVE THE AGE LIMITS PRESCRIBED CAN IN NO CASE BE RELAXED

The date of birth accepted by the Commission is that entered in the Matriculation or Secondary School Leaving Certificate or in a certificate recognised by an Indian University as equivalent to Matriculation or in an extract from a Register

of matriculates maintained by a University, and that extract must be certified by the proper authority of the University or the Higher Secondary or an equivalent examination certificate. These certificates are required to be submitted along with the Dated Application Forms which will be required to be submitted by the candidates who qualify on the result of the written part of the examination.

No other document relating to age like horoscopes, affidavits, birth extracts from Municipal Corporation, service records and the like will be accepted.

The expression Matriculation/Secondary Examination Certificate in this part of the instruction includes the alternative certificates mentioned above.

NOTE 1: CANDIDATES SHOULD NOTE THAT ONLY THE DATE OF BIRTH AS RECORDED IN THE MATRICULATION/ SECONDARY EXAMINATION CERTIFICATE OR AN EQUIVALENT CERTIFICATE ON THE DATE OF SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION WILL BE ACCEPTED BY THE COMMISSION AND NO SUBSEQUENT REQUEST FOR ITS CHANGE WILL BE CONSIDERED OR GRANTED.

NOTE 2: CANDIDATES SHOULD ALSO NOTE THAT ONCE A DATE OF BIRTH HAS BEEN CLAIMED BY THEM AND ENTERED IN THE RECORDS OF THE COMMISSION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADMISSION TO AN EXAMINATION, NO CHANGE WILL BE ALLOWED SUBSEQUENTLY (OR AT ANY OTHER EXAMINATION OF THE COMMISSION) ON ANY GROUNDS WHATSOEVER.

NOTE 3: CANDIDATES SHOULD EXERCISE DUE CARE WHILE ENTERING THEIR DATE OF BIRTH IN THE RESPECTIVE COLUMN OF THE APPLICATION FORM, IF ON VERIFICATION AT ANY SUBSEQUENT STAGE ANY VARIATION IS FOUND IN THEIR DATE OF BIRTH FROM THE ONE ENTERED IN THEIR MATRICULATION OR EQUIVALENT EXAMINATION CERTIFICATE, DISCIPLINARY ACTION WILL BE TAKEN AGAINST THEM BY THE COMMISSION UNDER THE RULES.

(iii) Minimum Educational Qualification:

For admission to the examination, a candidate must have—

- (a) obtained a degree in Engineering from a University incorporated by an Act of the Central or State Legislature in India or other Educational Institutions established by an Act of Parliament or declared to be deemed as Universities under Section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956; or
- (b) passed Sections A and B of the Institution Examinations of the Institution of Engineers (India); or
- (c) obtained a degree/diploma in Engineering from such foreign University/ College/Institution and under such conditions as may be recognised by the Government for the purpose from time to time, or
- (d) passed Graduate Membership Examination of the Institute of Electronics and Telecommunication Engineers (India); or
- (e) passed Associate Membership Examination Parts II and III Sections A and B of the Aeronautical Society of India; or
- (f) passed Graduate Membership Examination of the Institution of Electronics and Radio Engineers, London held after November, 1963.

Provided that a candidate for the post of Indian Naval Armament Service (Electronics Engineering Posts) and Engineer, Gr. 'A' in Indian Radio Regulatory Service-Gr. 'A' may possess any of the above qualifications or the qualification mentioned below namely:— M.Sc. degree or its equivalent with Wireless Communication, Electronics, Radio Physics or Radio Engineering as a special subject.

NOTE-1—A candidate who has appeared at an examination the passing of which would render him educationally qualified for this examination, but has not been informed of the result, may apply for admission to the examination. A candidate
